

Stakeholder Engagement – Teaming - Convening

- Involve multiple stakeholders
- Share leadership
- Build consensus
- Work together
- Plan together
- Make decisions





Who are the stakeholders?



Why multiple stakeholders?

- Various perspectives are key
 - Should not be responsibility of one person or be reflective of one person's opinion
 - build broader solutions and have a wider breadth of networks, skills, and strengths to leverage
- Perspectives needed:
 - Individual familiar with Part C and/or 619
 - Family members
 - Individuals familiar with data collection
 - Those familiar with data use
 - Individuals who understand the data and its limitations



Different Levels of Teaming

- Child Level Team
- System Level Team
 - Local and State Level Systems





Teams are effective when...

- there is a clear vision;
- members understand their role and team expectations;
- a clear plan is developed;
- processes and procedures are followed;
- they stay solution-focused and action-oriented;
- goals are revisited;
- the plan is monitored and adjusted as needed.
