1. <b>Timely Services</b>	Percent of children receiving timely services	C	State Data System and/or Monitoring
2. <b>Settings</b>	Percent of children who primarily receive services in home or comm-based setting	R	Child Count and Settings (EMAPS Survey)
3. <b>Child Outcomes</b>	Percent of children with improved functioning in 3 outcome areas	R	State-selected data source
4. <b>Family Outcomes</b>	Percent of families who report EI services helped them in 3 areas	R	State-selected data source (e.g. Family Survey)
5. <b>Child Find, Ages Birth to 1</b>	Percent of infants birth to 1 with IFSPs (using census data in the denominator)	R	Child Count and Settings (EMAPS Survey) and Census (for the denominator)
6. <b>Child Find, Ages Birth to 3</b>	Percent of children birth to 3 with IFSPs (census data in denominator)	R	Child Count and Settings (EMAPS Survey) and Census (for denominator)
7. <b>Timeliness of IFSP</b>	Percent of children with initial IFSP meeting within 45 days of referral	C	State Data System or Monitoring
8. <b>Early Childhood Transition</b>	Percent of children with timely transition steps/services, notification and conference	C	State Data System or Monitoring
9. <b>Hearing Requests Resolved</b>	Percent of hearing requests resolved through settlement agreements	R	Dispute Resolution (EMAPS Survey)
10. <b>Mediation Agreements</b>	Percent of mediations held that resulted in mediation agreements	R	Dispute Resolution (EMAPS Survey)
11. <b>State Systemic Improvement Plan (SSIP)</b>	Comprehensive, multi-year plan for improving results for infants and toddlers with disabilities and their families	R	Multiple data sources as described in the SSIP
