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2021 DaSy Data Systems (or State of the States) Survey Findings

Since 2013, DaSy has tracked the status of Part C and Part B 619 state data systems to understand states' technical assistance needs, provide stakeholders with a national picture of what capacities state data systems have, and to track how those capacities are changing over time. Most recently, in spring of 2021, DaSy collected comprehensive information on Part C and Part B 619 data systems using an online survey developed in coordination with the IDEA Infant and Toddler Coordinators Association for Part C programs and a parallel survey for Part B 619 programs. The Part C and Part B 619 surveys contained many of the same items.

All Part C and Part B 619 coordinators received a unique link to the online survey via email. Coordinators were encouraged to consult with data managers and others who are familiar with the state's early childhood data systems to compile their state's responses. DaSy received responses to the survey from Part C program staff in 49 states (94%) and from Part B 619 program staff in 48 states (92%).

The aggregated frequencies from the survey items are reported below in several tables. These data represent responses from state staff in the 50 U.S. states, the District of Columbia, and Puerto Rico.

DaSy's website presents these data disaggregated by state/territory on the State of the States maps (<https://dasycenter.org/state-of-the-states-2021/>).

How to read the tables

The tables below provide each survey item, the associated number of respondents (N), and frequency of responses (%) for each survey item. The number of respondents and frequencies appear for Part C and/or Part B 619 depending on whether a given item was asked in one or both surveys. The (*) symbol indicates that an item was not asked in a survey. Missing data are marked as (--). The (†) symbol indicates that an item was a multi-select question, thus frequencies may not add up to 100.

The use of brackets in a survey item indicates that the item was asked in both the Part C and the Part B 619 surveys, and that each respondent reported only about Part C or Part B 619. For example, one item reads, "State has at least one electronic centralized statewide data system that contains personally identifiable child level data for all or nearly all individual children who are enrolled and receiving [Part C/Part B 619] services." This item was asked in both surveys, and Part C respondents reported about these data in regard to children enrolled in and receiving Part C services; respondents from Part B 619 programs reported about these data in regard to children enrolled in and receiving Part B 619 services.
